



Oahu's Reentry Support System: A Community Resource Guide for the Formerly Incarcerated

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Purpose

Every day, individuals are released from our prisons and return to the community. Given our alarmingly high recidivism rate in the United States, there is a general agreement that prisons do not have enough rehabilitative programs. Instead, much of the responsibility of rehabilitating our incarcerated population is left to the community where they will return. This research project surveys all reentry resources that are present on Oahu so that we may better recognize the gaps in our own community. To that end, the author collected information from reentry-related organizations' websites and interviewed individuals who work at these organizations to better understand the services they offer. Additionally, the author surveyed older guides created by both criminal justice organizations and the State of Hawaii to determine how up-to-date and accurate the information is. The author concluded from this survey that an updated reentry guide is desperately needed. This information from the survey was then used to create this comprehensive reentry guide for formerly incarcerated individuals and their family to use so that they may be more aware of the wide variety of resources available to help them rebuild their life after incarceration.

How To Use This Guide

The resources in this guide are divided into multiple sections based on the needs that they address. Each section has a corresponding color and symbol that can be seen on the border of the pages. To easily find a specific section, flip to the pages with its color and symbol. Each resource includes a brief description of its services, contact information, and the closest bus stops if available. If a resource has multiple programs with different addresses and phone numbers, there will be a separate entry for each program and its information. If there are multiple locations for a resource, each location will be given separately with its nearest bus stops. All sections and each resource in each section are in alphabetical order. A red arrow at the bottom of a column means the entry continues on the next column.
